The main topic of the meeting will be <u>SAFETY</u>. Dr. Leonard Gordon from Ralph K. Davies Hospital in S.F. will give a slide/discussion on microsurgery, i.e., the restoration of severed digits and the repair of shop injuries. Plus...

We hope to have a few helpful ideas for prevention from a Cal/OSHA safety engineer. Plus...

Scott Page, our new Co-Chair, will lead a discussion about what sort of first aid supplies should be in a woodworking shop. Plus...

In the Spotlight will be Bob Winebarger presenting a slide show of his work. Plan to attend.

The <u>December meeting</u>, one of the best to date, was filled with a thorough and thoughtful presentation by Bob Greenberg about his harpsichords, and an insightful panel discussion led by Philo Bemis about the business of woodworking. Lewis Buchner, Donald Dupont, Bob Greenberg, Jon Grossman, Peter Good, Tim Kennedy, and Mike Laine participated.

Our semi-annual election of officers was also held and, as you can see later in the Newsletter, not all the executive positions were filled. It looks like the general reluctance of BAWA members to volunteer for the leadership slots will produce a crisis in five months when the present committee steps aside. BAWA may not stay in business if the members do not come forward to help. It almost didn't in December.

The Northern California Woodworkers' Association (NCWA) reports that it has 50-60 members and plans for the future. For publicity it is working with Ron Ashby and the Craftsman's Touch Gallery on Pier 39 in San Francisco on an article about the gallery for the Sunday magazine of a Bay Area paper. In addition, according to Stuart Welch, NCWA is considering a weekend seminar focusing on manufacturing problems.

Gary Bennett, the Untraditional Furniture Maker, will be giving his excellent slide show and talk at The Cutting Edge, 1836 Fourth St., Berkeley (548-6011) on Thursday, January 26th from 7-10 PM. The cost is \$25.00 and well worth it. Gary's work was recently featured in an article by John Marlowe in The Workshop newsletter published by the Wendell Castle Studio. It is a publication with good writing. The price is \$8.00/year and it is available from 18 Maple Street, Scottsville, NY 14546.




