

While the last minute scheduling prevented much publicity Rosewood Tool in Berkeley hosted a couple of wonderful and informative evenings with Liam O'Neill, from Shannon, County Clare, Ireland. O'Neill is one of the founders of the Irish Woodturners Guild.


O'Neill showed slides of the work of Irish turners and demonstrated his production techniques. "Production" in the sense that he makes his living at the lathe, but he does try to make each bowl unique. "Find what you're capable of doing and work to perfect it," is how he puts it. The Irish turners have access to magnificent Elm and Ash trees that allow them to economically turn out huge salad bowls with delightful grain pattern and carefully defined shape.

turn out huge salad bowls with delightful grain pattern and carefully defined shape. The deep bowl gouge with a steep grind right off the grinder is the tool of choice for O'Neill. He follows that with sanding discs from Merit abrasives (150 and 220 grit), and a polishing with 360 and 600 wet and dry and mineral oil and a sanker sealer finish. The bottoms of the bowls are finished on the lathe after the preliminary work is done with the item held in the three-jaw chuck. O'Neill mentioned in passing that the "6 in 1" chuck was "a piece of junk".

"A good design idea that didn't work".


