Where to buy it

I have received numerous inquiries regarding sources of supply for materials used in making my jigs, fixtures and templates. The items on the following lists are those most asked about, and are available in small quantities.

INDUSTRIAL HARDWARE AND SUPPLY —located in San Carlos at 975 Industrial Road. This is a genuine hardware store (no pots and pans) and the employees are quite helpful. This is almost a one-stop hardware store. For those interested I have discount cards available which, when presented with your BAWA membership card, entitle you to a ten percent discount.

Fasteners: an excellent selection of nuts, bolts (N.F., N.C., Metric), set screws, wood screws, thumb screws. wing screws, wing bolts, stud bolts, knurled brass nuts etc.

Pins: taper, steel dowel, clevis, expansion, cotter, hitch, etc.

Motor shaft keys: straight and woodruff

Retainer rings: external and internal

Threaded rod: various sizes up to 12 ft. long

O-Rings: very good selection

Pulleys: diecast and machined cast-iron

Springs: compression and tension, excellent selection

Machine knobs: diecast and high-quality plastic

Machine hand cranks, handwheels, levers: diecast and high-quality plastic in different sizes and configurations.

J & H OUTLET—located in San Carlos at 476 Industrial Road.

This is a surplus-type store that is clean and well organized. All items are binned and price-marked. The inventory varies; what is available at one time may not be available at another time. Their inventory includes:

Fasteners: limited, but some unusual nuts, bolts, washers, pins, spacers, etc

Hardware: unusual latches, levers and parts of mechanisms

Aluminum: good variety in extruded shapes, flat-round-square stock plus round and square tubing.

Plastics: acrylics, nicarta, delrin, nylon etc. Available in flat and round stock in a large range of sizes.

Plastic knobs: good quality small control knobs in several different sizes.

If this article is of any value to the membership, additional articles will follow.

We would all appreciate members submitting sources of hard-to-get materials in their locale.
