#### NEXT MEETING





Dave Downing of Pacific Slope Tree Co (868-2526) gave a fascinating program on cutting and milling local woods. Dave does tree work, removing unwanted or fallen trees, and many of those trees he turns into air-dried lumber. He brought sample boards of Eucalyprus, Bay, Camphor, Olive, Redwood and others. He showed slides of removing a blown-down tree that had fallen onto a house, and of cutting logs into slabs using band-saw and chain-saw mills.

With Dave was Martin Sweet, of the Hammersmith Guild (491-1502). Besides being a woodwoker, he works to facilitate the use of these local air-dried hardwoods by craftsman. He does secondary processing, breaking down the slabs that Dave Downing mills into smaller boards. Quoth Mr Sweet, "All of the trees around the Bay Area—these are the trees you should be using for woodworking." He spoke knowingly about how wood reacts to drying and to different types of cutting. He suggested that if we see a tree going down to grab it.


#### Board Meeting
