





This will be a "hands-on" demonstration. Things to bring: your scrapers, stones,
burnishers, files, a small vise, magnifying lens, & small 8-power lenses. Monroe will
check your edges and help you get a better edge on your tools. This will be a
top-of-the-line demonstration, well worth attending!

LAST MEETING

The January meeting was one where we the members of BAWA provided our own program, and it was a great meeting. We asked for people to bring things in to show and got a big response.

Glenn Kreug showed us a disk sander plate that he made for his lathe. Then there was a good deal of discussion on the best adhesives to stick sandpaper to a disk.

One chap named Gary showed us some planking clamps used in boatbuilding, grabbing a rib of the boat and pushing a plank against the next one. He also showed us a "hollowing plane," used for "backing out" planks, so they will conform to the curve of the ribs.

Another fellow named Peter showed a router with a nifty wooden base for trimming

Stan Booker demonstrated three router-tables he built to help teach his classes of 12-year-olds woodworking. Each table makes a particular cut in the process of making some very nice small boxes. The fixtures have numerous stops and guides to make them safe and simple. It can't be easy to enable a 12-year-old to use power tools to build something that isn't junky, that can give them a feeling of accomplishment. It was very impressive to see the ingenuity and care which Stan has put into these teaching aids. And of course Ernie Werkheiser's home-build oscillating spindle-sander was a big hit. His design is delightfully simple. The shaft that revolves the sanding drum can also slide up-and-down about an inch. The motor is connected to the shaft by a belt, and so doesn't mind if the shaft moves up and down a bit. A separate small motor moves the shaft up-and-down as it is turning. If you have ever used a sander like this you know that the two combined motions give you a very smooth surface.

REMINDER





Bay Area Woodworkers Association was formed early in 1982 by a small group of dedicated people who felt the need to strengthen the woodworking community by holding regular meetings, establishing an informal forum for the exchange of knowledge and ideas, sponsoring shows, and meeting others in woodworking and related fields. Since then, this non-profit organization has grown to many members. Meetings occur in the third week of each month at 7:00 p.m. and are generally held in San Francisco or Oakland/Berkeley area. Meetings usually have a specific topic such as router techniques, finishing, turning, business aspects of woodworking, or focus on a distinguished guest speaker who will give a presentation in their area of expertise. Most meetings are held in members shops, or the place of business of a guest presenter. Members receive a monthly newsletter.
