

#### October

This meeting was held at the San Francisco Maritime National Historic Park. John Muir himself hosted us in his small boat shop and also showed us the shop at the Dolphin Club. The Small Boat Shop at the museum is responsible for restoring, reproducing, maintaining, and replacing authentic boats that are under forty feet in length. Currently they are producing a craft that is a reproduction of a "turn of the century" naval scow and will be used for rowing. John took us through the steps of boat building from lofting all the way to steaming the planks. He has it on good word that there are forty way to steam a board, and he was sure our club members could help him with a few more "right" ways.

It was interesting to note the minimal amount of power equipment in the shop. We all probably drooled over the Oliver band saw, but the rest of the power tools seemed rather modest for a shop with so many responsibilities.

Anyone interested in building a boat is encouraged to come spend some time as a volunteer at the museum, give and learn and take classes. The hours are very flexible and can be accommodated to your schedule.
