John D. Alexander Jr. will present a 3-hour workshop on "How to Make a Chair from a Tree." Mr. Alexander is a lifelong student of the traditional woodworking technology of stick-chair making and joinery. He has been making chairs for over 30 years.

He has concluded that dry wood is harder to work than green. Furthermore, as green wood shrinks, it holds the parts of the chair together better. Mr. Alexander will explain the old ways of splitting and shaping wood to make a light, beautiful, and rugged chair.

He explained and demonstrated how to prepare the scraper using Japanese wet stones to polish

2 X 4 CONTEST RULES

During this April meeting, we will have the judging of the annual BAWA 2 x 4 Contest. Here's a review of the simple rules.

- 1. You can use a single 2" x 4" Douglas Fir* board no longer than 8 feet.
- 2. Any type of fasteners, except nails, may be used.
- 3. Operables/ornamentals may be used.
- No other materials (such as Plexiglas or plastic) may be used.
- There are no other design restrictions.

*In the past any type of wood could be used. Starting this year it was agreed to limit the material to only Douglas Fir. This is to eliminate the advantage usually provided by using exotic hardwoods.

 Woodline in Alameda and feature a




 grinder we have been discussing.

November 20.. We need input for this one.


December 18 .. Pot luck dinner!

the flat surfaces and a mill file to flatten the edges. He explained the technique of "draw filing" the edge to smooth the filed surface. Wet stones are then used to polish the edges of the scraper. A two-step process using a burnishing rod is used to draw a burr on the edge of the scraper, creating a cutting edge. Sharpening and adjusting the Stanley model 80 cabinet scrapers was also discussed and demonstrated. The sharpening process is very similar to the hand scraper. Carl also showed how easy it is to remove burn marks left from a power saw, using a hand scraper.

A copy of the presentation notes is included in the BAWA library. Request a copy if you did not receive one at the meeting. Knowing how to use these handy tools is essential for smoothing hard woods with rogue grain, Birdseye Maple, and burls.

The raffle prize won at the meeting was a beautiful piece of Koa wood.

The April meeting will be the annual 2 x 4 contest and tool swap. The 2 x 4 contest rules have been previously published, but if you have any questions about this fun contest, please

call one of the club officers. Any tools you wish to sell or swap may be brought to the meeting. There are usually some great deals to be had, so please plan to attend.

The April meeting location is the proposed new home base for BAWA. Your input regarding this site will be appreciated. If it is approved by the members, BAWA will have a place to house a book library that will be available to the members, in addition to the Tape library, Back to Basic presentations, and Internet notes currently hauled from meeting to meeting.
