

veneer patterns and basic veneering methods. Don then showed how to make your own vacuum bag, platen, and cauls. He reviewed glue types and explained where to purchase a used vacuum pump.

Don demonstrated how this all went together and operated, using an Edwards Hi Vac pump to draw the vacuum bag (made from shower pan liner and clear vinyl) down greater than one atmosphere, thereby applying more than a ton of pressure per square foot evenly on all surfaces of the veneer and substrate.

The raffle prize, a quarter piece of California Walnut donated by Don Naples, was held for the drawing at the next meeting.
