

#### Announcements

Newsletter editor Mike Bray mentioned that he'll be speaking on the topic of 'Hand Tools' at the April woodworking show in Pleasonton. He also reminded us about the upcoming 2x4 contest in July. Allen Harrison told the story of how he recently lost his shop to a fire. President Linda Salter discussed the upcoming picnic on August 19th. She also reminded all to get creative and make their club name badges. She announced the next toy making workshop to be held at her shop on May 6th. Carl Johnson and Arnie Champagne discussed the "Christmas in April" event. The silent auction netted a few members some great deals, but bidding was not very spirited, so some of the items will return at the next meeting. Next month's meeting will be at John Grew-Sheridan's shop in San Francisco.

#### Show & Tell

Several of you showed off your new name badges. Thanks! Mike Bray showed a finished piece of the redwood handrail he built. Last month we saw it in process. He shaped the lower half with a table saw and two cove router bits. He planed the top of the rail by hand. As it will be outdoors, he coated it with a penetrating liquid epoxy that soaks into the wood prior to painting. It is an incredible primer coat! Tony Fanning passed around his mouth harp box. We saw it last month in progress. The harp sits in a felt lined depression inside the walnut box. There's a small flat sterling silver fretwork circle inlaid into the cover of the box. The box is protected by a cloth bag. Very nice job. That is one item for the Box contest in October! 📽 Linda Salter showed a typical small, painted wood puzzle of the type that will be made at the next toy workshop. & Paul Reif showed a bench top router table. It has a laminate top with an accurate and easily adjusted fence, and storage space in the hardwood trimmed box below. W Bob Berryman displayed a Maloof style settee of black walnut that his son helped him build. As is typical of this style chair, many parts were shaped to avoid sharp right angles. While the entire piece contained beautiful wood, the chair back was particularly nice. It was made from a single beautiful walnut board. Molto bene! Bob's affection for Sam Maloof is evident every time he talks of Sam, but even if he never spoke a word, you could still see it in his execution of Maloof's designs.

#### Main Presentation

Our host and main speaker was Brent Merkley of JUSTASHOP in San Carlos. Brent built his shop as a hobby (his words) and went professional some years later. He built many of the machines in his shop, including a huge pin-router. He built in features that no commercial machine has, and even made the table for the pin router as a series of segments, to maximize use of space in his small shop. The segments all go back together in perfect alignment every time. He also built a panel saw, a router carriage for turning cylinders, and a vacuum forming station for making plastic parts. Brent also has older machines that he refurbished. One example is the huge cast-iron bandsaw just inside the door. Besides all the work he did to get the saw running smoothly, Brent also engineered a large adjustable fence for resawing his own veneer. Wandering through that shop was an amazing experience. Thank you Brent for a memorable visit!


