
THIS MONTHS' MEETING January 18th 3rd Thursday

The January 18th, 2001 BAWA meeting will be held at the **Thos. Moser Cabinet-maker** showroom at 3395 Sacramento Street, San Francisco. You can preview their work at www.thosmoser.com.

Thos. Moser started out making Windsor chairs in Maine. Then he decided to go big and expand his line of furniture - to produce in larger quantities and handle marketing and sales himself. There are now showrooms in three major cities, including the one in San Francisco. What did this transformation involve; how does he control production quality (their website points out that their furniture is not made by assembly line, but rather individual craftspeople assemble the pieces before sending off to the finishing department); who now does the designing; how big can this go?

Our host for the evening will be John Walker, the Thos. Moser Cabinetmakers Showroom Manager and a key member of SF3D (San Francisco Furniture Design Forum). John has been the manager for five years and is conversant with design, distribution, marketing, pricing and more.



There is adequate seating and coffee will be provided. Come to our first meeting of 2001 and examine how one woodworker became an industry!

From North Bay: Take 101 South over the Golden Gate Bridge onto Lombard. Turn right onto Divisadero. South to Sacramento Street, go five blocks west to Walnut.

From East Bay: West on 80 across the Bay Bridge to the 9th Street exit. Head north on 9th Street. Continue across Market Street veering to the left onto Hayes Street. Turn right onto Franklin then a left onto California Street. Turn right onto Walnut street, go one block to Sacramento Street.

From South Bay: North on 280 to 19th Avenue exit. Stay on 19th through Golden Gate Park as it turns into Park Presidio Blvd. Turn right onto California Street, then a left onto Walnut to Sacramento Street.

Ample parking is available at UCSF. The parking structure is located at Walnut and California. The parking entrance is to the left of the main entrance off California Street. Put one dollar in the machine and it will give a receipt. Put that receipt inside your car visible through the front windshield. Then walk a block on Walnut to 3395 Sacramento Street.
